## **Adult Referee Overview**

The In-House boys basketball program is one of several Burnsville Athletic Club (BAC) organizations. We are an all-volunteer organization dedicated to providing recreational basketball for Burnsville's youth. We accept boys from third grade through high school that live within ISD 191 and Burnsville and typically manage 80-90 teams.

We are an equal participation league and equal playing time is documented on the game score sheet. Our rules are adjusted from grade to grade to promote skills development. Coaches are volunteers, typically the parent of one of the players on a team.

There are ten regular season games. Grades three through nine play most of their games on Saturdays (8 AM to 6 PM). The high school teams play most of their games on Sunday (12 noon to 6 PM). Most games are played at Burnsville High School or one of the three Burnsville junior highs. All BAC teams are eligible for a tournament at the end of the season, which culminates with Championship weekend at the High School courts. The BAC basketball season runs from January through mid-March.

In recent years, many of our referees have cut back on commitments, retired or are no longer officiating. We know that it is time to add some new members to our referee team. We are looking for 6 - 10 new referees.

Our referee experience level varies. Some have done games at the high school, college and or traveling basketball levels. Some do it for the fun, some for some extra cash and others for the exercise. We are looking for adult referees <u>with or without</u> experience.

The ideal referee will have a fair understanding of the game and have the ability to officiate 2 to 4 games on Saturdays and/or Sundays.
